Disability, Poverty and Gender

Approximately 1.3 billion individuals, roughly 16% of the world's population, experience considerable disabilities and women have a higher prevalence of disability (18%) compared to men (14%).

In the US, nearly 50% of adults with disabilities are living in or near poverty levels compared to 28% of those without disabilities. Black and Indigenous people with disabilities have the highest poverty rates compared to all other people, with or without a disability.

In 2019, the US median earnings were \$30,193 for disabled men (\$43,568 for nondisabled men) and \$21,185 for disabled women (\$31,403 for non-disabled women), indicating a significant sex-related disparity aggravated by disability status.
