Poverty and Female-Headed Households*

The high poverty rate among working single mothers (29.3%) would fall to 15.8%, nearly by half, if they were paid the same as comparable men.

In the European Union, 2/3 of single mothers report serious economic difficulties.

In the US, female single heads of household with children under 18 from minority ethnic groups face the greatest level of poverty: 42% of Indigenous mothers, 37% of Black mothers, 36% of Latina mothers and 25% of white mothers.
