The Impact of Poverty on Native American Women and Girls *

The Native American gender wage gap costs Native American women 40 cents to the dollar compared to white males. That adds up to approximately \$2000 per month, a loss of nearly \$1 million over a lifetime of work. Native American women are also disproportionately likely to have low wage, service jobs.

Native American children have the highest childhood mortality rate when compared to all other racial and ethnic groups in the US. Native American women suffer intimate partner physical and sexual violence at rates twice as high as white women.

Unemployment rates for Native Americans are significantly higher than other workers. In 2021, it was 1.5 times higher (8.5%) than workers overall (5.8%).
